Zahakiel: Happy Sabbath to everyone, and welcome to the Feast of Tabernacles of 2016. I do not wish to speak for very long tonight, although certainly if there are any who wish to have a discussion afterwards, this is often as valuable a part of our time together as whatsoever I happen to present. What I want to speak about tonight, as we open the Feast, is actually just a continuation of the study from last week, "Thou Shalt Be Joyful."

It is Yah's intention, and expressed wish, that His people be joyful. This is why He remains with us. This is why His Spirit rests upon us, to guide, rebuke, correct, and comfort. That is why He has given us these times of refreshing. He has given us instructions regarding our health and moral choices. We know what is righteous, not because of our own opinions and limited experiences, but because He who is infinite in wisdom and knowledge has set it before us in language that we can understand. As it is written, as the Book of Hebrews begins, "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by His Son, whom He hath appointed Heir of all things, by whom also He made the worlds." (Heb. 1:1, 2)

In times past, the Creator has taught us through the words of the prophets, and through the teachings He delivered to us through them, including those contained in rites, rituals, and ordinances. In this time, the Son has fulfilled many of these activities; however, the message that the Father has for us has never changed. His means of speaking to us has been "diverse," and sadly, those who have not had the Spirit of Christ have always been left behind when the means has changed, caught on the hooks of familiarity or complacency. We see this, as CSDAs, very clearly with regard to the proper understanding of the Beast and its image.

A few weeks ago, we spoke at some length about the idea that Yah will sometimes permit errors among His professed people to stand. Disappointment reveals humility. Remaining

within a group of believers despite their miscalculations reveals loyalty, and we have seen this very clearly at such times as the dawn of Adventist history.

The Feast of Tabernacles represents the very last moments of human history, the great harvest of the earth. "At sundry times, and in divers manners," Yahweh has revealed to us the spirit and the truth of this Harvest. We understand the parables of the Savior and its symbolism of seeds, growth, maturity, and finally the reaping. We see in this language the path of sanctification, performed by the Son, and revealed in our victorious testimonies.

The symbols associated with the Feast have changed over time, of course. Moses received instructions for revealing its sanctifying influence to the Israelites. The Hebrews who settled in Canaan, and then the apostles received different observances, such as the Last Supper, which likewise, and appropriately for the time, revealed those things given to them for their perfection.

In our day, Yah again speaks to His people through His Son. The message is the same, but the times and activities are different. Here we are, scattered across the world, and yet the Father has not left us without His holy witness. Here we are, few in number and persecuted from both the enemies of the Gospel...and, at times, those who claim to be Its believers. But in all this, through all troubles and trials, we rejoice. We are commanded to be joyful. We have this time in particular to celebrate before Yahweh, and to rejoice.

As we have long taught, we can experience nothing, we are asked to endure nothing, except that which the Father and Son permit to penetrate Their loving embrace, and the mighty wings underneath which we shelter. If something comes upon us, whether a benefit or a challenge, whether a praise or an accusation, we can know with certainty that it has been measured for us – with infinite wisdom and limitless care – from the foundation of the world for our sanctification and blessing. Do we believe this? If so, then how can we be anything but joyful? How can we be anything but settled into the Father's love, so that nothing can by any means move us?

This is what the Feast of Tabernacles is for us. This is the lesson that Yahweh desires His people to know, and in which to rejoice during this appointed time. Whether we have a meeting together, or whether we are reading our Bibles on days when we have no official meeting, or whether we use the time to evangelize, this is our cause for rejoicing.

It is not every day this week that we have a formal convocation. This is good... again, the experience has been measured for us, and permitted to be just so, by our Father. I encourage us to make the best use of however we use the time. We have been placed within the light of Yah's blessings, and we must by all means make sure our hearts are prepared to receive them. Even now the Creator is showing us new, and ever more glorious, ways to participate in His blessing. I suspect that the next feast will have some considerable differences from this one.

And yet, as we see how the activities have changed, from Moses, through the early and then later dynasties of Israel, through the early followers of Christ, and down to us, we also see that the Word, and its benefits for us, are constant. Our current needs for this age are being met, even as it was promised, for "my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Yahshua." (Phil 4:19)

Tonight, I rejoice in the provisions that Yahweh has revealed, both for my benefit individually, and for the Church and my brethren collectively. We shall not fail, nor be discouraged, for He does not permit His people to be ashamed before the world, nor to suffer and know want beyond what is strictly for our good.

Finally, I want to say this: Although we do not have "themes" for our feasts as such, I would like to suggest an area of focus. It is nothing new. The best lessons are those we hear again, but in a new way, with more sanctified and enlightened eyes and ears. I would suggest that we think, and pray, and meditate, on "communication." Perhaps, for example, during one of our days we can review the STARS study. On all days, I pray we will have free, sanctifying conversations.
